have which means you cannot get all voters from any one county or city. I think it is good, not too restrictive, and is worthy of consideration.

MR. SCANLAN: The point is if you don't do that, what you have here makes it even easier to petition a law to referendum than the situation now permitted under the present Constitution, which is bad enough.

THE CHAIRMAN: Further discussion?

DR. BARD: I think the provision underscores the significance that the issue is state-wide and important.

MR. SAYRE: I think the biggest restriction here is the 5 per cent. When you get a requirement of 40,000 votes under these terms that even if it is within one county or two that is a significant part of the state-wide referendum.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further comment?
