MR. CASE: Mr. Chairman, when Article 16 was passed, in 1914, I think the division between Baltimore City and the rest of the state was about 50-50. between Baltimore City and the rest of the state. That is no longer true and it will never be true again. Because Baltimore County with its almost 550,000 people now is rapidly approaching in size Baltimore City, it would not be without the realm of imagination to see that perhaps by 1980 Baltimore County will be as large as Baltimore City. I don't see the reason for making this distinction between Baltimore City and the rest of the State. It seems to me if you want this kind of provision, it ought to be that no more than X per cent should come from any one political subdivision.

MR. BOND: I will accept Mr. Case's amendment.

THE CHAIRMAN: The other Committees are making recommendations that for all purposes Balti more City be treated as a county so that you could cover the point by saying of whom not more than one-half come from any one county.
