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involves more than three counties then it would be the state, feeling that the new area would be the state as a whole when you get into such a revision.

MR. CASE: That is where the vote would be taken.

MR. CLAGETT: Yes.

MR. CASE: But what we are talking about is where you gather the signatures.

MR. CLAGETT: As the Chairman said, one metropolitan area, even though couched in terms in effect that are general, is the only one that the legislation was being passed for, there is no reason why that area shouldn't activate the referendum and have that protection because referendum is, after all, nothing more than a protective device to the people who happen to be opposed to what is happening to them.

MR. CASE: Supposed to be.

MR. CLAGETT: Supposed to be.

MR. GENTRY: The Committee in recommending deletion of this, which is now passed, the bracketed language, there was no sentiment expressed by anyone for
