the Legislature which would redistrict Congressional districts. These words, I suppose, have become a term of art. As it stands now, a plan to reapportion the legislative seats in the General Assembly could not be petitioned to referendum but it could be argued that because of the phrase used, reapportioning, a statute which redistricted the Congressional districts could be subject to referendum. I gather from one of your previous remarks that was not your intention.

PROFESSOR ASPER: We understood that the thing that was to be withdrawn -- perhaps we understood it too narrowly -- was state reapportionment.

MR. SCANLAN: I would now move that the following language be inserted in Line 2 following the comma after state: Including the Congressional districts thereof comma. It would make it perfectly clear that neither reapportionment of the legislative seats nor Congressional seats could be subject to referendum. That is the intention of my proposed amendment.

THE CHAIRMAN: Before we get on that exact language, I am bothered by the language, the phrase
