one thing which has not been commented on today but may have been earlier. You withdraw from the referendum the law imposing a tax. That is not in the present Constitution. Am I correct?

PROFESSOR ASPER: We were directed again, as

I recall, at Easton, to include revenue raising measures
as we noted in the comment and revenue raising measures
we thought that this was a better expression for what
we thought the Commission had in mind with that directive.

THE CHAIRMAN: Iraise the question because we didn't specifically discuss this language in July.

Does anybody have comment?

MR. CASE: I remember what happened. I called your attention to the fact that the sales tax which was passed in 1947 was subject to a voluminous referendum petition. I think they had more signatures for that than anything short of the savings and loan bill, and that the court held in that case that twisting, I might say, the language of Article 16 considerably to reach the result in my judgment that a tax bill was a revenue bill within the meaning of what was here.
