All those in favor, please signify by saying aye.

Contrary, no. The ayes have it. So ordered.

MR.GENTRY: Section 1 states simply as we can the principle of popular sovereignty in these words. All political power originates in the people and all government is instituted for their security, benefit, and protection. It is felt that this picks up in essence and in such shorter language all of what is embraced now in sections 1, 4, 6, and 7 of the present declaration.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any comment or question?

MR. CASE: Mr. Chairman, I will be frank to admit I don't know quite what we voted on, Mr. Sayre's motion. But if the vote was to accept the format of the Declaration of Rights as it has now been suggested in this report, then I want to be recorded as violently opposing it. Though I may be stepping on some toes around this table, I ask in advance your forgiveness, but I will do everything in my power to fight against it, not only here, but elsehwere. My reasons --
