

1 All those in favor, please signify by saying aye.

2 Contrary, no. The ayes have it. So ordered.

3 MR.GENTRY: Section 1 states simply as we
4 can the principle of popular sovereignty in these words.
5 All political power originates in the people and all
6 government is instituted for their security, benefit,
7 and protection. It is felt that this picks up in essence
8 and in such shorter language all of what is embraced
9 now in sections 1, 4, 6, and 7 of the present declara-
10 tion.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: Any comment or question?

12 MR. CASE: Mr. Chairman, I will be frank to
13 admit I don't know quite what we voted on, Mr. Sayre's
14 motion. But if the vote was to accept the format of
15 the Declaration of Rights as it has now been suggested
16 in this report, then I want to be recorded as violently
17 opposing it. Though I may be stepping on some toes
18 around this table, I ask in advance your forgiveness,
19 but I will do everything in my power to fight against
20 it, not only here, but elsewhere. My reasons --
