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gladly.

MR. CASE: I move that Section 1 be rewritten to contain as far as possible the language of Section 6.

THE CHAIRMAN: Is there a second?

DR. BARD: I will second it but I want to offer an amendment.

THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Bard.

DR.BARD: I am interested in a countermotion which would seek to preserve the language not
just in Section 6 but in a large portion of the
Declaration of Rights when it seems appropriate.

MR. CASE: I would accept that amendment

DR. BARD: This is the way I would like to see the motion read rather than for any particular section because I do think your main point from my point of view is well taken.

MR. SCANLAN: Mr. Chairman, I agree with Dick's main point. I don't concur in his criticism of the workmanlike job that the Committee has done but I think the language he has referred to in Section 6 plus some other eloquent phrases found in the earlier part of the
