

EVENING SESSION.

SATURDAY, May 11th, 1861.

The Senate resumed the further consideration of the bill entitled,

An act to add a new section to article twenty-eight of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the rights and duties of County Commissioners.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, moved a call of the Senate, when the following Senators answered to their names :

Insert the word "volunteer" after the word "efficient," in the fifth line of first section, and the same word after the word "which," in said line of said section.
