A bill, entitled, An act to authorize and empower Francis Mattingly to erect gates upon a road passing near his house, to the Catholic church, near Mount Savage;

Which was read the first time, and referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. McKaig, Stone, and Nuttle.

A bill, entitled, An act further to define the duties of the State Librarian;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on the Library.

A bill, entitled, An act to authorize the Vestry of St. Peter's church, in the town of Salisbury, in Somerset county, to take, have, and hold, a lot of land devised by the last will and testament of William Henry Dulany;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

A bill, entitled, An act to amend the 31st section of the 5th Article of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the compensation of the jurors and bailiffs of Calvert county;
