On motion of Mr. Stone,

Leave was granted Messrs. Stone, Lynch and Smith to report a bill to authorize the Commissioners of Washington county, in their discretion, to guarantee the bonds of the Western Maryland Railroad.

On motion of Mr. Heckart,

Leave was granted the Committee on Militia to report a bill to abolish the State Armories at Easton, Talbot county, and at Frederick city, Frederick county, as well as the office of Armorer at these Armories, and authorize said real estate on which said Armories are located to be sold, and the proceeds of such sales to be placed in the Treasury of the State.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, submitted the following message:
