The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bill, entitled,

An act to repeal the 41st, 42d, 43rd, 46th, 47th, 48th and 112th sections of the 63rd Article of the Code of Public General Laws, and the 741st, 742d and 743rd sections of the 4th Article of the Code of Public Local Laws of the State, in relation to the uniform and militia and volunteer forces in the several counties of this State and in the city of Baltimore, and for the custody, control and delivery of arms heretofore delivered to the officers and men under them;
