Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, offered the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Librarian be instructed to deliver to the Academies and Library Associations of the different counties in the State any duplicate copies of law and miscellaneous books as may in his judgment be dispensed with, without prejudice to the interests of the State, after a catalogue of said books now in said Library shall have been made out.

Which was read the first time.

The Senate adjourned.
