So the Senate adopted the substitute.

A bill, entitled, An act to repeal the 890th section of the 4th Article of the Code of Public Local Laws, giving certain powers to single justices of the peace in the city of Baltimore, in relation to landlords and tenants, and to substitute therefor a section increasing the power of such justices in the premises;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Judical Proceedings.
