Mr. Kimmel, from a select committee, reported favorably upon the following bill:

A bill, entitled, An act to amend the 112th Article of the Code of Public Local Laws, by adding thereto the following sections, relating to the going at large and running away of slaves, and resorting of slaves and free negroes to military posts and encampments in Frederick county, and to repeal section 16 of Article 66, of the Code of Public General Laws, so far as it applies to Frederick county;

Ordered, That such members of the Senate as may feel disposed to sign the report of the joint committee on Federal Relations, and the resolutions thereto attached, may be permitted to do so at their discretion.

Mr. McKaig declined acting on said committee, and offered the following order:
