Leave was granted Messrs. Dashiell, Blackistone, and Goldsborough, of Dorchester, to report a bill relating to public schools in Somerset county.

Was referred to the Committee on Militia.

Mr. Bradley, from a select committee, reported

A bill to release from the payment of interest the sureties on the official bond of Samuel L. Duhamel, Collector of Taxes for the first election district of Queen Anne's county in the year eighteen hundred and fifty-seven.

Which was read the first time.
