

On motion of Mr. Smith,

Ordered, That the Sergeant-at-Arms of the Senate procure one hundred copies of the bill, entitled, "An act to amend the eighty-third article of the Code of Public General Laws, by exemption a certain amount of property from execution," to be printed for the use of the Senate, and that on the third reading of said bill amendments may be offered thereto as if it was upon its second reading.
