REPORT:

From the select committee to whom was referred the bill entitled, An act making an appropriation for the Maryland Penitentiary, beg leave to make the following report: That it was expected by the committee appointed by the last Legislature, of which I had the honor to be the Chairman, to examine into the affairs and management of said institution.

We then found that said institution really required an appropriation to meet the necessary expenses and liabilities, although at that time all those prisoners able to work were employed in the different work shops, but the receipts were then considerably in arrear of the disbursements, but no appropriation was then made. Now, owing to the present alarming crisis through which our country is passing, and the general prostration of business, the Contractors have suspended business operations, in consequence of which it is really necessary that relief should be afforded by making said appropriation.

We therefore report favorably.
