AMENDMENT TO SECOND SECTION:

Provided, That nothing herein contained shall apply to any free negro who may have obtained permission to leave the State from the Orphan's Court of the county in which he or she may live, or from the Orphan's Court of Baltimore city, if such free negro be a resident of said city, in accordance with the existing statutes of this State."
