Wednesday next, in reply we respectfully suggest that there are various measures of public importance yet not finally acted on, and which, in our judgment, should be acted upon before the adjournment. We, therefore, respectfully propose the appointment of a joint committee of conference to consist of four members of the Senate and four members of the House to confer and report in regard to the unfinished business, and also in regard to the time of adjournment.

We have appointed Messrs. Yellot, Goldsborough, of Dorchestor, Townsend and Duvall on the part of the Senate, as

said committee.
