Leave was granted to the committee on Federal Relations to introduce a bill to make valid a payment of \$250 dollars paid by Wm. Delehay, late Sheriff of Caroline county, to Joseph E. Muse, the then acting Attorney for the State of Maryland.

Ordered, That this House deems it entirely inexpedient to entertain any local legislation during this, its Extra Session, or any general, except such as the public exigencies imperatively demand,
