BY THE SENATE

June 8, 1861.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

We respectfully ask of your Honorable body, to return a bill entitled, an act to amend the XVIIIth article of the Code of Public General Laws, by adding thereto sections giving to the clerks of the Circuit courts and the Superior court of Baltimore city and the court of Common Pleas, the power to take supersedeas of judgments and decrees, rendered in said courts.

The message was concurred in, and said bill returned to the Senate.
