Leave was granted to the Anne Arundel county delegation to bring in a bill empowering the Judge of the Circuit court for Anne Arundel county, in his discretion, to suppress licences for the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors or lagerbeer in quantities less than a pint, within the city of Annapolis, suspending certain sections of article LVI of the Code of Public General Laws therein named, so far as the same effect the city of Annapolis.
