Mr. Harrison, chairman of the committee on Currency, reported favorable upon the bill, entitled an act to amend Article XII, of the Code of Public General Laws relative to the payment of specie by the banks of this State;

On motion of Mr. Chaplain, the second reading of the bill was re-considered.

Said bill then being upon its second reading,

Mr. Harrison proposed the following amendment:

Sixth line, section first, strike out the word "repealed" and insert the word "suspended";

Which was adopted.

The bill, as amended, was then read the second, and by special order the third time, and passed by yeas and nays, as follow:
