ceive pay during the recess is conceded, but in view of the financial condition of the State, the undersigned would respectfully suggest that the mileage, according to the rate established by the committee appointed at the extra session, be taken by the members and officers, and he therefore submits the following order:

Ordered, That the committee on Claims are hereby directed to pay to the members and officers of the Senate and House of Delegates the mileage paid at the extra session of this General Assembly; and also that the members and officers from Anne Arundel county be paid forty dollars each; from Baltimore county, forty-five dollars; from Calvert county, forty-five dollars; from Charles county, fifty dollars; from Prince George's county, forty dollars.
