

Said bill was then sent to the Senate.

Mr. Kessler, from a select committee, reported favorably upon a Senate bill entitled, an act adding an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate the Metropolitan Railroad company, passed at January session 1853;

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Gordon, from the committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably upon a bill entitled, an act to amend article XXIX of the Code of Public General Laws, by adding thereto a section extending the lien of judgments to leasehold interests in land;

Which was read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Griffith,

The rules were suspended to enable him to present the petition of John M. Viers and other citizens of Montgomery county, asking the passage of an act requiring parties petitioning for opening roads in said county to pay all expenses incurred therein, when such road or roads are not granted;

Which was read and referred to the Montgomery county delegation.

Mr. Maxwell offered the following:

Ordered, That the committee on Claims be directed to pay Mrs. Schleigh for ice furnished for use of the House of Delegates;

Which was adopted.

Mr. Gordon, from a select committee, reported favorably upon a bill entitled, an act to authorize the commissioners of Allegany county to pay George L. Layman for certain services rendered as constable;

Which was read the first, and by special order the second and third times, and passed by yeas and nays, as follow:
