Which was adopted, and

Said bill was referred to Messrs. Harrison, Bryan, Goldsborough, Scott and Chaplain.

Mr. Jacobs, from a select committee, reported favorably upon a bill entitled, an act to add new sections to the Local Laws of Worcester county, under the head of oysters;

Which was read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Chaplain, The House, at  $2\frac{3}{4}$  o'clock, adjourned.

## TUESDAY, June 18, 1861.

The House met and was opened with prayer by the Rev. Mr. Diehl.
