Mr. Maxwell offered the following:

Which was adopted, and Messrs. Compton, Mackubin and Briscoe, constituted said committee.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to make valid the qualification of John Merryman, as first lieutenant of the Baltimore county Horse Guards;

Severally endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

On motion of Mr. Griffith,

Leave was granted to the Montgomery county delegation to introduce a bill legalizing the sale of potatoes by measurement in Montgomery county.

Mr. Gordon submitted the following:

To the General Assembly of Maryland:

The joint committee appointed by the Senate and House of Delegates for the purpose of considering the propriety of an

adjournment, beg leave to report—

That your committee have given due consideration to the petitions from different parts of the State requesting the General Assembly to adjourn sine die, but your committee think that the prayer of said petitions ought not to be granted. The character of the petitions show that many of the persons signing them are actuated by party influences, rather than a
