property that shall be mentioned therein, and that the librarian shall be responsible for all of said books, documents and property in case of their loss, unless he shall obtain a receipt in writing for the same from his successor; and the said receipt when given shall be equally conclusive against said successor.

Resolved, That a committee of three, to consist of two members of the House of delegates and one member of the Senate, shall be appointed to examine into the state of the library, and report at the next meeting of this session such information on the subject as they may think necessary, and to superintend and direct the making of said catalogue;

Which were read the first time.
