Strike out, in Section 1st, the words "remain over one day, and—"

Which was adopted.

Mr. Stake moved to refer it to the committee on the Judiciary.

Mr. Compton moved the previous question ;

Which was sustained.

The question then being—"shall the main question be now put?"

It was sustained.

The question then recurred upon the original motion ;
