Report of Mr. Wallis from the, on the state of the country, (Document F.) with resolutions on the subject of the war and the Military occupation of Maryland, 106, 107; report accepted, and 10,000 copies ordered to be printed, 108; resolutions read a first time, and made the order of the day for Friday, 110; read a second time and substitute resolutions offered by Mr. McCleary, 117; amendments proposed and rejected, 118, 119; substitute rejected, 120; amendment adopted, 121; read the second time and passed, 122; resolutions returned from the Senate passed, with an amendment appointing a committee of four members of each House to visit President Lincoln and Davis, to obtain if possible a cessation of hostilities, and report on the 5th day of June next, adopted, 156; also concurring in the resolution fixing the time of adjournment, 157.

Order requesting the Speaker to forward one copy of the Preamble and Resolutions, as above, to each of the Governors of the slave and free States, adopted, 157.

Resolutions from the Senate proposing the appointment of committee from each House to visit the President of the United States and the President of the Southern Confederacy, and the Governors of Virginia and Pennsylvania to endeavor to avert civil war, read a first time and referred to, 110; unfavorable report thereon, adopted, 139, 142.
