

## FEDERAL RELATIONS, COMMITTEE ON—

Order reported from, that a committee be appointed with powers to examine the Executive records, and ascertain and report to this House the precise character of the relations established by the Executive with the Federal Government, since the commencement of our national troubles, read the first time, 229; read the second time and adopted, and committee appointed, 244; message from the Governor, in relation thereto, referred to said committee, 266.

Also, resolutions protesting against the illegal arrest of Ross Winans and other citizens, and the tyrannical exercise of military jurisdiction within the State, by the Federal Government and requesting our Senators in Congress to present them to the U. S. Senate, &c., read the first time, 229-30, further considered 244, 253, 262, 279, 286; read a second time, and passed, 292; returned from Senate passed, 313.

Senate resolutions relative to the destruction of the property of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, referred to, 251; reported favorably, and passed, 276.

Senate resolutions of Mr. McKaig, referred to 313.

Petition in favor of the release of Manuel C. Causten, imprisoned in Virginia; referred to, 318.

Resolutions from, requesting the Governor to return to the State Armories the Arms, removed to Fort McHenry by his order, &c., passed, 320.

Communication presented from the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, relating to the Board of Police Commissioners, (Document L,) referred to the committee on Federal Relations, 340.

Senate resolution proposing that the committee on Federal Relations of the two Houses act as joint committee on the Memorial of the Baltimore Police Commissioners, (Document L,) concurred in, 364; report thereon made, read a first and second time, and passed, and 25,000 copies ordered to be printed, 365; returned from Senate passed, 381.
