Which was adopted.

Also, proposed the following resolution:

Resolved by the House of Delegates of Maryland, (the Senate concurring) That Otho Scott, R. M. McLane and Wm. J. Ross be, and they are hereby appointed Commissioners on the part of the State of Maryland, to communicate immediately in person with the Pressdent of the United States in regard to the present and any proposed prospective military use or occupation of the soil and property of the State by the General Government; and they are directed to ascertain and report to the General Assembly forthwith, for its consideration, whether any becoming arrangements with the General Government are practicable in that connection for the maintainance of the peace and honor of the State and the security of its inhabitants.
