Which was referred to the Baltimore city delegation.

On motion of Mr. Ford,

It was ordered to be entered on the journal that the absence of Mr. Hunter, from his seat in this House, is occasioned by sickness.

Mr. Long, chairman of the committee on Ways and Means, reported the Senate bill entitled, an act to release from the payment of interest and sureties on the official bond of Samnel L. Duhamel, collector of taxes for the first election district of Queen Anne's county, in the year 1857.

Mr. Lawson, from special committee, made a favorable report upon the bill entitled, an act to repeal the one hundred and ninety-eight section of Article XIX of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to Public Schools in Somerset county;

Which was read the second, and by special order the third time, and passed by yeas and nays as follow:
