Chap. 304 Acts 1955—Ten yr. exemption of new business established after 6/1/55 if valued over \$30,000 & gives employment to 20 or more persons.

100% mfg. inventory and machinery used in first processing of agricultural commodities for human consumption. Cold storage & food processing classed as mfg. mach.

Canned goods classed as mfg. inventory.

Exemption: greater of \$1,500 or 25%; 25% of remainder exempt.

Mfg. inv. 10 yrs. from 1961

Ordinance No. 1340 exempts manufacturers' inventory and machinery for 1961, \$15,000 or 75%; 1962 and thereafter, entirely exempt.

Ordinance No. 1522, effective July 1, 1958, exempts certain personal property of new industries and the expansion, under certain conditions, of established industries.

HOUSEHOLD FURNITURE AND EFFECTS.

Under Chapter 708 of the Acts of 1945, the following counties assess household furniture after an exemption of \$100:

Dorchester County
Frederick County.

All other counties and Baltimore City give 100% exemption for household furniture and effects.
