

- (1) Takes title to the vehicle free and clear of any claim of ownership or lien;
- (2) Is entitled to a sales receipt from the police department; and
- (3) Is entitled to obtain a certificate of title of the vehicle and register it in his own name.

(c) The sales receipt is sufficient title for transferring the vehicle to a scrap processor for dismantling, destroying, or scrapping, in which case only a certificate of title is not required.

(d) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle:

(1) From the proceeds of the sale of an abandoned vehicle, the police department shall reimburse itself for the costs of towing, preserving, and storing the vehicle and the expenses of the auction, including all notice and publication costs incurred under this subtitle; and

(2) Any remaining proceeds of the sale shall be held for 90 days for the owner of the vehicle and any entitled secured party, after which the remaining proceeds revert to [the]:

(I) THE treasury of the county in which the sale was made; OR

(II) IN THE CASE OF A MUNICIPALITY THAT CONDUCTS THE SALE, THE TREASURY OF THE MUNICIPALITY.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1990.
