(b) Except for the construction of pump-out stations for use by THE general boating public at public and private marinas, the governing body and the Waterway Improvement Fund jointly shall finance projects to construct marine facilities beneficial to the boating public. The contribution of the Waterway Improvement Fund shall be limited to not more than 50 percent of the cost of each project. However, the Waterway Improvement Fund may finance completely any construction project beneficial to the boating public which costs less than \$25,000 regardless of its location.
