AN ACT concerning

Calvert County - Orphans' Court Judges - Practice of Law

FOR the purpose of providing that in Calvert County, orphans' court judges may practice law under certain circumstances; and generally relating to orphans' court judges in Calvert County.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Estates and Trusts

2-109.

- (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a judge of the court may not act as an attorney at law in a civil or criminal matter during a term of office.
 - (b) This section does not apply:
 - (1) In Harford County;
 - (2) In Montgomery County;
- (3) In Baltimore City, to a judge of the court while practicing law before any court of the State except an orphans' court; or
- (4) In Prince George's [County] AND CALVERT COUNTIES, to a judge of the court while practicing law in connection with a case that is:
 - (i) Outside the jurisdiction of orphans' court; and
 - (ii) Unrelated to the administration of an estate or guardianship.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1990.
