CHAPTER 410

(House Bill 515)

AN ACT concerning

The Drug Enforcement Act of 1990

FOR the purpose of authorizing certain licensing authorities to impose sanctions on certain persons under certain conditions for a controlled dangerous substance offense under certain circumstances; requiring certain persons who apply for certain licenses to provide certain information on the application under certain circumstances; setting forth disciplinary actions that may be imposed against a certain person convicted of certain offenses before and after a certain date; requiring persons who apply for certain licenses to provide a certain certification; providing that certain licenses be suspended upon the failure to report certain information; authorizing the Motor Vehicle Administration to disqualify an individual from driving a commercial motor vehicle or to take other actions for a controlled dangerous substance offense under certain circumstances; requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to issue a noncommercial driver's license under certain circumstances; requiring the courts to ascertain information from certain persons convicted of a certain offense; at time of sentencing to make certain findings regarding an individual's licenses under certain circumstances; providing that certain information shall be forwarded to a certain office and certain licensing authorities under certain circumstances; authorizing the adoption of regulations by certain agencies and the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals; requiring certain licensing authorities to submit reports to certain persons annually; requiring certain businesses to take certain steps to maintain a drug and alcohol free workplace; requiring the suspension of the driving licenses of certain persons convicted of certain offenses for a certain period; repealing the maximum fine for possession of certain controlled dangerous substances; establishing a mandatory minimum fine for possession of certain controlled dangerous substances; requiring a licensing authority to conduct a hearing and make certain determinations concerning certain applicants and licensees under certain circumstances; repealing and
