- (A) IF A CHILD IS FOUND TO HAVE COMMITTED A DELINQUENT ACT AS A RESULT OF A VIOLATION OF ARTICLE 27, § 286, § 286A, § 286B, § 286C, § 286D, § 287, OR § 287A OF THE CODE AND IS LICENSED TO DRIVE A MOTOR VEHICLE IN MARYLAND. THE COURT SHALL ORDER:
- (1) THE MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION TO SUSPEND THE DRIVING PRIVILEGE OF THE CHILD FOR A PERIOD OF 1 YEAR: AND
- (2) IF LICENSED BY THE STATE, THE CHILD TO SURRENDER THE DRIVER'S LICENSE TO THE MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION WITHIN 30 DAYS OF DISPOSITION.
- (B) IF THE CHILD FAILS TO SURRENDER THE DRIVER'S LICENSE TO THE MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION AS ORDERED, THE SUSPENSION SHALL CONTINUE UNTIL 1 YEAR AFTER THE DRIVER'S LICENSE IS SURRENDERED, UNLESS GOOD CAUSE IS SHOWN TO THE MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION WHY THE LICENSE WAS NOT SURRENDERED.
 - (C) A SUSPENSION UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION:
- (1) IS EFFECTIVE 10 DAYS AFTER THE ISSUANCE OF THE COURT ORDER; AND
- (2) MAY NOT BE MODIFIED BY THE COURT OR MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION.
- (D) A RESTRICTED LICENSE MAY NOT BE ISSUED TO A CHILD WHOSE DRIVING PRIVILEGES HAVE BEEN SUSPENDED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.
- (E) IF A CHILD SUBJECT TO A SUSPENSION UNDER THIS SECTION DOES NOT HOLD A LICENSE TO OPERATE A MOTOR VEHICLE ON THE DATE OF DISPOSITION, THE COURT SHALL NOTIFY THE MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION OF THE ADJUDICATION AND THE MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION SHALL REFUSE TO ISSUE A LICENSE FOR A PERIOD OF 1 YEAR FROM THE DATE THE CHILD APPLIES FOR A LEARNER'S OR DRIVER'S LICENSE.
- (F) AN APPEAL OF THE ADJUDICATION DOES NOT STAY THE IMPOSITION OF ANY SUSPENSION BY THE MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION.
