of perjuty, whether the licensee has been convicted of a controlled dangerous substance offense and, if so, with respect to each conviction, the date of sentencing, the name of the sentencing court, and the name under which the licensee was sentenced; and (2) agree that the individual will, within 5 days of a conviction, inform the licensing authority in writing if convicted of a controlled dangerous substance offense during the term of the license. Failure to complete and return the form within 30 days of receipt is grounds for suspension of the license.

(H) THE ADMINISTRATION MAY DISQUALIFY A PERSON FROM DRIVING A COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE FOR A CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCE OFFENSE IN THE MANNER PROVIDED UNDER ARTICLE 41, TITLE 1, SUBTITLE 4 OF THE CODE.

Drug Enforcement - Transactions - Proceeds From Controlled Dangerous Substance Offenses

FOR the purpose of making it a crime to receive or acquire certain proceeds, to engage in certain financial transactions, and to exchange certain proceeds or promote certain transactions of proceeds derived from a controlled dangerous substance offense under certain instances; establishing certain penalties; requiring financial institutions and certain businesses and trades to file certain reports with the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services Licensing and Regulation; requiring the Secretary of Licensing and Regulation to promulgate adopt
