- (5) (4) THE EXTENT TO WHICH THE LOCATION OF THE VIOLATION, INCLUDING LOCATION NEAR AREAS OF HUMAN POPULATION, CREATES THE POTENTIAL FOR HARM TO THE ENVIRONMENT OR TO HUMAN HEALTH OR SAFETY;
- (6) (5) THE AVAILABLE TECHNOLOGY AND ECONOMIC REASONABLENESS OF FOR CONTROLLING, REDUCING, OR ELIMINATING THE EMISSIONS THAT CAUSED THE VIOLATION; AND
- (7) (6) THE EXTENT TO WHICH THE CURRENT VIOLATION IS PART OF A RECURRENT PATTERN OF THE SAME OR SIMILAR TYPE OF VIOLATION COMMITTED BY THE VIOLATOR.
- [(b)] (C) Each day a violation continues is a separate violation under this section.
