SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(d) If the complaint concerns any other person, the Commission promptly shall refer the complaint to its staff counsel for further action. With respect to such complaints:
