

- 1. Nets, seines, trawls, and pots used in ocean but including not more than 200 yards of gill nets.....\$100
- 2. Nets and seines used in bays but including not more than 200 yards of gill nets.....\$50
- 3. Pots and fykes used in bays, except there shall be no fee for up to 50 pots used, by a licensee who is authorized to catch crabs pursuant to this section, to catch eels for personal use as crab trotline bait.....\$25
- 4. Hook and line, anywhere.....\$25
- 5. More than 200 yards of gill nets and all equipment in 1. through 4. above.....\$125

(viii) [For] SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SUBPARAGRAPH (XI) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, FOR a resident to catch any fish in tidal waters by any methods which are lawful under Subtitles 2, 7, 8, 9, and 10..... \$200

(XI) TO CATCH FOR SALE STRIPED BASS WITH A LICENSE ISSUED UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (II) AND (VIII) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE LICENSEE SHALL PAY A FEE EQUAL TO THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE ANNUAL FEE OF THE APPLICABLE LICENSE AND \$250.

(f) (1) In addition to any other penalty provided in this title, the Department may revoke for a period of not less than 10 days nor more than 365 days a person's entitlement to engage in a particular activity or activities under a tidal fish license.

(2) During a period of revocation imposed by the Department, the person penalized is not and shall not be authorized under any existing, renewed, or new tidal fish license to engage in the particular activity or activities for which the revocation is imposed.

(3) The following are grounds for revocation under this section:

(i) Making any false statement in an application for a tidal fish license;

(ii) Conviction of a person for violations under this title so often as to indicate an intent to disregard the fish and fisheries laws of the State, provided that proceedings for revocation on this ground are based on no fewer than:

1. 3 convictions for violations occurring on separate days within any 365 day period, of provisions under 1 subtitle of this title; or

2. 5 convictions for violations occurring on separate days within any 365 day period, of any provisions under this title; or

(iii) Failure to submit reports required by the provisions of this title or by the Department pursuant to provisions of this title; or

(iv) Failure for a nonresident of the State to appear in court pursuant to a citation issued by a Natural Resources police officer, or to any other process issued by any court of Maryland, for violation of this title.
