recognized church or religious denomination of which he is an adherent or member may not be required to take these screenings.

7-403.1.

- (a) In this section, "scoliosis" means a lateral curvature of the spine, which can develop into a permanent crippling disability if left untreated.
- (b) Each public school system in conjunction with the county health department shall provide scoliosis screening tests for all students in that public school at least once in grades 6 through 8.
- (c) If a student is suspected of having scoliosis, [the parent or guardian of the student shall receive:
 - (1) A copy of the screening report; and
- (2) Information about:] A COPY OF THE SCREENING REPORT SHALL BE:
- (1) GIVEN TO THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF THE STUDENT WITH INFORMATION ABOUT:
 - (i) The condition of idiopathic scoliosis;
 - (ii) The significance of treating scoliosis at an early stage; and
 - (iii) Services available for treatment after diagnosis; AND
 - (2) SENT TO THE COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT.
 - (D) THE COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT SHALL:
- (1) ASCERTAIN IF THE SERVICES RECOMMENDED BASED ON THE RESULTS OF THE SCOLIOSIS SCREENING HAVE BEEN OBTAINED;
 - (2) DETERMINE IF ADDITIONAL SERVICES ARE NEEDED; AND
- (3) REPORT THE RESULTS OF THE SCOLIOSIS SCREENING AND THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS RECEIVING THE RECOMMENDED SERVICES TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE.
- [(d)] (E) A student whose parent or guardian objects in writing to the screening may not be required to be screened.
- [(e)] (F) A person who performs any screening required by this section is not liable for any civil damages resulting from acts or omissions in the screening not amounting to gross negligence.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1990.
