

THEN BECOME LAW UNLESS THE PLAN IS SET ASIDE BY A COURT OF LAW WITH PROPER JURISDICTION. AFTER THE PLAN BECOMES LAW, THE BOARD SHALL TERMINATE ITS EXISTENCE.

(4) NECESSARY CLERICAL ASSISTANCE SHALL BE PROVIDED TO ASSIST THE DISTRICTING BOARD BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

(5) THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SHALL APPOINT NEW REDISTRICTING BOARDS WITHIN ONE (1) YEAR AFTER THE PUBLICATION OF THE NATIONAL DECENNIAL CENSUS AND THE SAME PROCEDURE OUTLINED ABOVE SHALL BE FOLLOWED FOR ALL SUBSEQUENT REDISTRICTING BOARDS, INCLUDING THE TIMETABLE ESTABLISHED HEREIN.

27-2. SALARIES AND COMPENSATION; BUSINESS HOURS ESTABLISHED; REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES.

A. MEETINGS.

(1) THE COMMISSIONERS SHALL MEET FOR THE TRANSACTION OF BUSINESS:

(A) ON TUESDAY AND WEDNESDAY OF EACH WEEK, EXCLUDING LEGAL HOLIDAYS;

(B) AT A PUBLIC PLACE DESIGNATED FOR ITS MEETINGS;

(C) PROVIDED PUBLIC NOTICE OF THE CHANGE IS GIVEN AT LEAST SEVEN (7) DAYS PRIOR TO A MEETING IN AT LEAST TWO (2) NEWSPAPERS OF GENERAL CIRCULATION IN THE COUNTY, ON ANY OTHER DAY THAT THE PRESIDENT OF THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OR A MAJORITY OF THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS DETERMINE.

(2) THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MAY CONDUCT AN EMERGENCY CLOSED MEETING AS AUTHORIZED UNDER § 10-508 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE.

(3) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION A(1) OR (2) OF THIS SECTION, THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MAY CANCEL MEETINGS BECAUSE OF:

(A) ILLNESS;

(B) VACATIONS; OR

(C) ANY OTHER REASONABLE CAUSE.

(4) THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SHALL GIVE NOTICE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 10-506 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, OF:

(A) THE DAY, PLACE, AND TIME THAT THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEET; AND
