ANY SOURCE IN THE AREAS OF BALTIMORE CITY DESIGNATED BY THE UNITED STATES POST OFFICE AS ZIP CODE NUMBERS 21225, 21226, AND 21230 A SOURCE DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (A)(3) OF THIS SECTION, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:

- (I) REQUIRE AT THE EXPENSE OF THE APPLICANT THE PREPARATION OF A COMPREHENSIVE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT AN AMBIENT AIR QUALITY IMPACT ANALYSIS REGARDING THE PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION; AND
- (II) REQUIRE FROM THE APPLICANT A WRITTEN STATEMENT CERTIFYING THAT THE SOURCE MEETS ALL APPLICABLE ZONING AND LAND USE REQUIREMENTS.
- (c) If the Department receives a written request for a public hearing within 10 days of the public notice required under subsection (b) of this section, the Department shall schedule a public hearing and give public notice of the date, time, location, and subject of the hearing, at least 30 days before the scheduled hearing.
- (d) Except for a notice in the Maryland Register, any notice required under subsection (b) or (c) of this section shall be in a form approved by the Department and published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area concerned at the expense of the applicant.
- (e) (1) Except as provided in paragraph [(2)] (3) of this subsection and subject to the provisions of this section, the Department shall issue or deny a permit within 60 days after the latter of the:
- (i) Receipt by the Department of all information necessary for the Department to act on the application, INCLUDING ANY ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT AMBIENT AIR QUALITY IMPACT ANALYSIS THAT MAY BE REQUIRED IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (B)(2) OF THIS SECTION;
- (ii) Publication of the notice required under subsection (b) of this section; or
  - (iii) Conclusion of the public hearing.
- (2) RESULTS OF ANY ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT AMBIENT AIR QUALITY IMPACT ANALYSIS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY BE A BASIS FOR THE DEPARTMENT'S DENIAL OF A PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT.
- [(2)] (3) If a public hearing is held under the provisions of this section, and if no information is presented that would affect the issuance of the permit, and if the Department has no other basis for denying the permit, the Department shall issue the permit within 5 working days after conclusion of the public hearing.
- (f) The provisions of this section do not apply to any permit to construct control equipment on an existing source.
