alcohol; establishing a certain minimum days of care for patients at the rehabilitative level in alcohol and drug abuse facilities; requiring that a certain number of physicians certify in writing what level of care is necessary for a patient; and generally relating to managed care for the allocation of alcohol and drug abuse insurance benefits requiring certain private review agents who perform certain reviews of health care services related to the treatment of alcoholism, drug abuse, or mental illness to meet certain requirements under certain conditions; defining a certain term; requiring certain private review agents to file certain standards and criteria with the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene, hospital utilization review programs, and certain intermediate care facilities; requiring the Secretary to provide a copy of certain standards and criteria upon written request; authorizing the Secretary to establish a certain fee; prohibiting a private review agent from revising or modifying certain criteria or standards under certain circumstances; specifying that any determination to deny or reduce coverage shall be made by certain persons; requiring certain private review agents to meet certain conditions when making a certain final determination; providing for a certain study; requiring that a certain final determination be stated in writing including certain criteria; and generally relating to the utilization review of services related to the treatment of alcoholism, drug abuse, or mental illness.

Preamble

WHEREAS, In 1988, legislation was enacted that mandated that group health insurers provide certain minimum benefits for the treatment of alcoholism and drug abuse; and

WHEREAS, The minimum benefits for the treatment of alcoholism and drug abuse in any calendar or policy year were set at:

- (1) 7 days of emergency care or detoxification in an acute general hospital or a nonhospital detoxification facility;
- (2) 30 days care for the treatment of drug abuse, alcohol abuse, or alcoholism in an alcohol and drug abuse facility; and
