- (2) To practice electrology and teach [the clinical practice of] AN electrology EDUCATION PROGRAM.
- (g) "Licensed electrology instructor" means, unless the context requires otherwise, an electrologist who is licensed by the Board to practice electrology and teach [the clinical practice of] AN electrology EDUCATION PROGRAM.

5-301.

(a) Except as otherwise provided in this title, an individual shall be licensed by the Board before the individual may practice electrology or teach [the clinical practice of] AN electrology EDUCATION PROGRAM in this State.

5-302.

- (d) Except as otherwise provided in this title, an applicant shall be a high school graduate or have completed equivalent education and have completed satisfactorily:
- (1) An electrology education program, TAUGHT BY A LICENSED ELECTROLOGY INSTRUCTOR, that is approved under this title and that includes:
- (i) [At least 20 hours of instruction] INSTRUCTION in the theory of electrology [taught by a physician; and] OF:
 - 1. UNTIL JULY 1, 1991, AT LEAST 66 HOURS;
 - 2. UNTIL JULY 1, 1992, AT LEAST 133 HOURS; AND
 - 3. ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 1992, AT LEAST 200 HOURS;

AND

- 1. AT LEAST 25 50 HOURS FOR A LICENSE GRANTED ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 1990 AND BEFORE JULY 1, 1991;
- ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 1991 AND BEFORE JULY 1, 1992;
- 3. AT LEAST 68 118 HOURS FOR A LICENSE GRANTED ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 1992; AND
- (ii) [At least 80 hours of instruction] INSTRUCTION in the clinical practice of electrology [taught by a licensed electrology instructor; or] OF:
 - 1. UNTIL JULY 1, 1991, AT LEAST 133 HOURS;
 - 2. UNTIL JULY 1, 1991, AT LEAST 266 HOURS; AND
 - 3. ON OR BEFORE JULY 1992, AT LEAST 400 HOURS.
- 1. AT LEAST 95 145 HOURS FOR A LICENSE GRANTED ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 1990 AND BEFORE JULY 1, 1991;
- 2. <u>AT LEAST 115 165 HOURS FOR A LICENSE</u> GRANTED ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 1991 AND BEFORE JULY 1, 1992; AND
