~~(3) With another person who is under 14 years of age and the person performing the sexual contact is four or more years older than the victim.~~

~~(b) Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a felony and upon conviction is subject to imprisonment for a period of not more than 10 years.~~

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1990.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 646.

This bill specifies that subsidiaries of the Medical Mutual Liability Insurance Society of Maryland may issue professional liability insurance policies and related property and casualty insurance policies in certain states or jurisdictions under specified conditions.

House Bill 754, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 2, 1990, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 646.

AN ACT concerning

**Medical Mutual Liability Insurance Society of Maryland – Subsidiaries**

FOR the purpose of specifying that subsidiaries of Medical Mutual Liability Insurance Society of Maryland may issue professional liability insurance policies and related property and casualty insurance policies in certain states or jurisdictions to certain persons; specifying the conditions for issuing the policies in other states or jurisdictions; providing that all debts, claims, obligations, and liabilities of a subsidiary shall be the debts, claims, obligations, and liabilities of that subsidiary only; providing that a subsidiary shall be subject to regulation by the State Insurance Commissioner of Maryland to the same extent as the Society; requiring the Society and its subsidiaries to file certain reports with the Insurance Commissioner and the Legislative Policy Committee; requiring a subsidiary to file
